Before you go live, make sure everyone can enjoy your stream. This pre-stream accessibility checklist is designed to help streamers quickly review their setup for audio clarity. visual readability, and overall accessibility.

Audio & Captions

- Enable captions using Web Captioner, OBS plugins, or platform settings
- ☐ Test microphoue for clear, distortion-free.sound
- Avold background noise, music with lyrics, or sudden loud alerts
- ☐ Add live audio descriptions for visuals when relevant

Layout & Interface

- Webcam, chat, and alerts are consistently placed
- Avold clutter—space out elements and stick to a visual grid
- ☐ Important info (like gollsr is visible and easy to understand

Visual Readability

- ☐ Use high-contrast overlays(e.g, white.on dark backgrounds)
- ☐ Fonts, large. sans-serif. easy-to-read
- Avoid flashing lights or rapid strobe effects
- Choose colorblind-friendly palettes (no red/green combos)

Content & Communication

- Use plain, clear language avoid excessive slang
- Speak descriptions of visual cues out loud
- Allow time between topics or gameplay transitions
- Prepare a visual or text summary of key info in chat or on-screen
